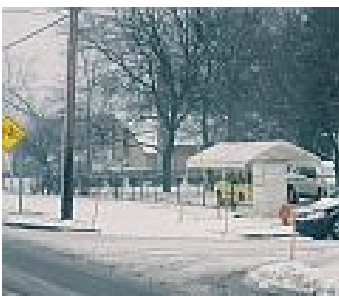
Mission Statement
